## **Butterfly Class**





## Squirrel Class

It has been a short but busy Spring term in Squirrel Class. The children have worked hard and had lots of fun at the same time.


The children have found our topic Turrets and Tiaras interesting. Our journey started during the Stone Age, through to the Iron Age and hill top forts. The children then learnt about Motte and Bailey castles, discovering that our very own Dudley Castle is a good example of this. The latter part of the topic has been looking at famous Kings and Queens of England. Henry VIII and his wives being a particular favourite.

Through our topic the children have produced some amazing art work using pastels. The children have recreated Stone Age Cave Art by tracing animal shapes, then smudging pastels over the top. We made the paper look like stone by using tea bags to colour the paper. The children also enjoyed using the pastels and smudging to create Stonehenge silhouettes.

In art the children have been learning about Georges Seurat and Pointillism. They have explored colour by mixing colours using dots. They created colour wheels and have used the technique to fill outlines of Henry VIII, using small and large dots to create texture.

We were lucky to have a visit from the Animal Lady also this term. We met a wide range of animals and learnt about how they survive and help humans, among the animals was Cornflake the corn snake, a giant cockroach, bearded dragon, owl and a cute and cuddly honey bear. The children were amazing. They held the animals, stroked them and showed enormous respect for them. It really was a highlight of our term.

The children have enjoyed a range of stories through our English; Stone Age Boy, and books by Nicholas Allan; The Queen's Knickers, The King's Pants and Cinderella's Bum, this has given the children a giggle and helped develop language skills, descriptive writing and a love of books.







#### Owl Class

Through our topic 'Superheroes Rule!', we have learn't about and described Superheroes and created our own. Through our humanities sessions we have learnt about areas of the UK, including mountains and rivers and also their related Patron Saints. We have enjoyed looking at different types of transport and explored what George Stephenson invented.

We have read and explored various stories and texts together that link to our themes. Some of these have included, Superkid, Superhero Mum, Supertato, Kindness is Superpower, Even Superheroes had a Bad Day, Superworm and Super Daisy and the peril of Planet pea. Through our English sessions, we have continued to complete many activities that have supported and developed our language and communication skills. We have worked on our writing, spelling, and fine motor skills and have completed daily phonics sessions to support and develop our reading skills.

In Maths, we have continued to work on our number and place value skills and have explored shape, size, mass, position and direction, pattern, time and money. We have also completed focused learning tasks to develop our using and applying skills to promote our life long skills.

In Science, we have explored pushes and pulls linked to everyday objects and our lives. We have worked with and investigated magnets and found and sorted items into magnetic and non-magnetic groups. Learning about electricity has been lots of fun as we have explored electrical items and have thought about how they contribute to our daily lives. We have also learnt about how to keep safe when using electricity.

In PE, we have learnt to play dodgeball and have completed activities linked to improving our skills when doing this. We have also been working with coaches from the Wolves Foundation as part of the 'Sporting Chances' programme.

Learning through our topic has involved us in creating pieces of artwork in the style of comics and Pop Art. We designed and made our own Superheroes and gave them a name. We have enjoyed using Beetbots and have been able to develop our skills in using directions and following a route or path. In Life Skills sessions we have had lots of fun exploring our forest school and making homes for minibeasts. We have also developed our cooking skills making pizzas, toast, biscuits and cakes and also learning how to peel and prepare vegetables. What a fantastic term, well done Owl Class!











# Frog Class



Throughout our literacy lessons, we have completed a range of prewriting and writing activities that related to each story. The children continued to complete lots of activities that supported and developed their language and communication skills. We have had daily phonics sessions, and this has enabled the children to further develop in their reading and writing. Throughout our Maths lessons, we continued to work on our number and place value skills alongside Shape, Space and Measure and also Using and Applying. Over the term, we explored shape, size, mass, position and direction, time, money and pattern. We completed focused learning tasks to develop our using and applying skills that actively promoted our lifelong skills linked to maths. In Science, we have learnt about pushes and pulls, magnets, electricity and electrical safety when using a range of appliances. Our activities and learning throughout our topic have involved creating pieces of artwork and exploring technology. In art this term, we have been learning all about 'Pop Art'. The children had great fun creating their own Pop Art and Superhero characters.

During our R.E lessons, we have been learning about what makes a good leader and discovered how this links to religious figures and roles. In our PE sessions, we have developed our skills in Gymnastics and movements. We have also been learning to play dodgeball and work as a team, with the support of the Wolves Foundation coaches. The children have shown a fantastic attitude towards their learning this half term and we have had lots of fun. We have enjoyed a visit from the 'Animal Man' and have welcomed our families into class to share all our wonderful work and achievements. We look forward to continuing our learning

#### Ladybird Class

This term we have had a super time working on our topic, Let's Move!

We have learned about lots of different forms of transport and different ways that we can move too. During our English lessons we have continued to work hard to practise writing our names and are continuing to develop our pencil control, mark-making and letter formation skills. We have explored lots of lovely stories linked to our topic this term, such as We're Going On A Bear Hunt, Whatever Next!, The Journey Home From Grandpa's and The Train Ride. We have worked on sequencing our stories, recalling key events and role playing our favourite parts.



In Maths we have engaged with number play; finding numbers in different places, singing number songs and sensory number markmaking. We have also continued to work on counting forwards and backwards, matching numerals to their quantities and ordering numbers. We have really enjoyed going on shape hunts around our



school environment, exploring heavy and light on balance scales and working on capacity by filling and emptying containers and recognising full and empty.



In Science this term we have worked on exploring the properties of materials, investigating which materials float and sink, developing

our knowledge of loud and quiet and exploring magnetism. During our PE lessons this term we have enjoyed travelling in lots of different ways and continuing to develop our ability to using the climbing equipment. We have loved having the opportunity to visit Sycamore Adventure this term to further our gross motor skills. As well as this, we have been working on our ball control skills; throwing balls at a target and controlling balls with rackets.



During our RE and PSHE lessons this term we have worked on making goals and targets for us to reach and exploring how we feel when we achieve something important to us. We have also focussed on how to live a healthy lifestyle by looking healthy and unhealthy foods and what we can do when we're not feeling well. We enjoyed a lovely visit from the Animal Lady this term, as well has spending a lovely morning completing Mother's Day crafts and celebrating Comic Relief! we hope Ladybird class have a wonderful Easter break with their families and friends! #### Woodpecker Class

What a fantastic Spring term it has been in Woodpecker Class! Our topic has been 'Let's move'. We have listened to lots of stories including 'Beep Beep Maisy' 'The Train ride' and many more. The children loved the story of 'Grandpa's Journey home' and have often sang this in the class room! Another favourite story has been 'We're going on a bear hunt'. We enjoyed learning some Makaton signs and actions to the story. Some of the children have been acting out the story as part of their imaginative play. It has been amazing to see! The children's language skills have really developed since the start of September.

We have continued to practise our phonics letter sounds through songs, action and a range of activities. We have been practising the Twinkl phonics sounds and actions to help us remember our letters. The children have practised their fine motor skills by forming the letters of different sounds. We enjoyed getting messy with rice, sensory bags and paint to form our letters.

In Math's we have practised our counting skills and number recognition. We have explored practical ways of representing numbers by using teddies, cars and cubes. We have continued to practise singing our nursery rhymes. We love '5 currant buns' and 'Ten green bottles'. As part of our shape, space and measures we have looked at coins. The children have explored coins through role play and particularly enjoyed exchanging coins for an item/toy of their choice.

Our favourite part of the Spring term has been our weekly trip to Sycamore. The children have loved to explore in the outdoor environment. The children have had lots of opportunities to practise their independence skills by dressing and undressing for suitable weather. Lots of us have enjoyed splashing in muddy puddles, climbing and the 'go kart 'rides from Mrs Farrington and Miss Lappage!









#### Hedgehog Class

We have had a wonderful term in Hedgehogs! The class have done brilliantly with the change of class teacher, and it has been so lovely getting to know everyone.

Our topic this half term was "Let's Move" The children explored a range of books within our English lessons including: We're Going On A Bear Hunt, The Train Ride, The Journey Home From Grandpa's and We All Go Travelling By. Story time in class has been so enjoyable, with everybody sat down around our board, listening to the stories and developing vocabulary. We can look forward to more exciting books and story time next term. Every child has shown a great effort in developing their writing skills including making marks to represent their names. In Phonics, the children have continued their learning of level 2 sounds. This has included exploring objects that contain the phoneme sound as well as great progress in making marks to represent graphemes. They have learned to carefully start their pencils in the correct position to form the grapheme and are working really well to try and follow the dofted lines. During maths, we have developed our number recognition, counting skills and number formation. We have explored differences in size and weight to identify which item is greater and which is less. We have continued to develop personal and social skills, including travelling on the minibus to take part in a range of activities at The Sycamore Centre. Hedgehog class have enjoyed attending weekly assemblies and have practised sitting and listening skills in the process. We've had lots of fun during weekly bucket times sessions, learning about vocabulary and watching with excitement at what item will appear from the bucket. This excitement has also been seen in music when children have learnt about loud and quiet sounds as well as learning

to start and stop playing their instruments on command.







We loved our Animal Man visit and had the experience of seeing a range of animals in person and not just in books and images. It was also great to welcome parents in for our Mother's Day coffee and crafts morning, it was an enjoyable and lovely event.

#### Badger Class

We have had a wonderful start to Spring term! The children have settled in really well and we have had lots of fun in our learning. Our topic this term was Once upon a story and we focused on traditional tales such as 'The Gingerbread Man', 'The Billy Goats Gruff' and lots more! Our favourite tale was Goldilocks and the Three Bears as we really enjoyed exploring porridge oats with our senses!

Our children have been enjoying their daily sessions of phonics, developing our

phonological awareness of s,a,t,p,i,n graphemes. They have enjoyed handling objects from our feely bag that begin with said graphemes. In Literacy we have been developing our comprehension through the use of colourful semantics focusing on who, doing, what. We have also been working hard on our fine motor skills, practicing our grasp when holding pencils for our marvellous mark making.

During Maths, our class have looked at consolidating our knowledge and understanding of number and place value through using concrete resources and number songs. During our shape, space and measure, we looked at exploring 2D shapes within our environment by going on a shape hunt, roleplaying with money, as well as grouping objects based on features. We have also taken part in learning looking at big and small.

In Topic, we have looked at exploring Art and Design and we have really enjoyed using our imagination to create collages with different materials. In Music, we have enjoyed engaging with different instruments, particularly the cymbals during Chinese New Year! In Understanding the World, we've enjoyed learning about materials and their properties. We love using our senses to help us learn. Our children have also enjoyed their fortnightly trips to Crystal Leisure Centre for developing their gross motor skills such as climbing, crawling and rolling.

We hope you all have a wonderful Easter break and we're looking forward to seeing you in Summer Term for another terrific term of wonderful learning!

I hope you all have an amazing Easter break. Have lots of fun! Miss Jukes and the team.










## Caterpillar Class
