Butterfly Class

During this term Butterfly Class have worked on the topic 'Marvellous Monsters.' We have learnt about Animals, the Human Body and Ancient Greece in our afternoon sessions. We created artwork in a range of media around this theme, including designing and making our Medusa head dresses and designing our own Greek Mosaics.



In English we focused on the following texts: The Colour Monster, Monsters – An Owner's Guide, Monsters Love Underpants, Billy and the Beast, It's Behind You – A book of monster poems. As well as these stories, we looked at a range of Ancient Greek Myths, including The Minotaur, Medusa, Hercules, and The Trojan Horse. We are pleased to see the range of stories covered have been enjoyed by all of the children this term.

Butterflies and Squirrels visited Halesowen Town Hall to watch the production of 'There's a Monster in my show.' This was a thoroughly enjoyable experience and the children smiled all of the way through.



Within Humanities, the children explored the location of Greece, tasted food and learnt important facts about the country. During the second half term, the children learnt about life in Ancient Greece and how it wasn't always the same for boys and girls in the past. The children really enjoyed learning about the different Gods and Goddesses of Ancient Greece, and finding out what they were the Gods of. We have taken part in many celebration days, including 'Spanish Day,' 'Children in Need,' 'Odd Socks Day,' 'Remembrance Day,' and 'Jolly Jumper Day.' The children also produced a lovely Harvest Assembly back in October.



It has been a busy term, finished off with a visit to Sycamore Adventure, and the school Christmas Production of 'The Twinkly Nativity.' The children have all worked really hard this term and have earned a well-deserved rest!

Squirrel Class

It has been a very busy and enjoyable Autumn term in Squirrel Class. Our topic Marvellous Monsters has taken us to Greece, where the children have learned about modern day Greece as well as Ancient Greece and the clues to their lives left behind. The children have enjoyed tasting Greek food and learning about childhood, buildings and the Gods and Goddesses that were worshipped by the Ancient Greeks. In English we have stayed with a monster theme, reading some wonderful stories and poems, these include; 'The Colour Monster', 'Monsters Love Underpants', 'Monsters: An Owners Guide' and a selection of poems from the book 'It's Behind You'. In the second half of the term our focus has been on Greek Myths and Legends, the children particularly enjoyed meeting the monsters Medusa, and the Minotaur. During our English lessons we have been developing our vocabulary and understanding of texts. We have written our own descriptions of characters and settings, thinking about adjectives and verbs. We use Colourful Semantics to support the children's speaking and writing, developing their grasp of grammar.

In Maths we have worked on our number and place value knowledge, with all children making good progress in this. We have then begun applying this knowledge within our addition and subtraction and multiplication and division. The children have enjoyed exploring fractions, shapes, measure as well as money.

During our science lessons the children have learnt about different animal groups and have been learning about the human body and how our organs work. The children enjoyed making a heart and lungs to see how blood pumps around the body and how our lungs look when we are inhaling and exhaling.



We have been thinking about who we are and how we fit in to our school, and how to treat others and how to deal with conflicts in a positive way during our Jigsaw PSHE lessons. Whilst in Life skills we talked about the importance keeping safe and identifying dangers at home and in the wider community, including crossing the road safely. We have also talked about the importance of good hygiene and why we need to wash and keep ourselves clean.



The highlights of our term have been our visit to Sycamore Centre to see Santa and receive a gift from him, our Christmas performance, 'Twinkly Nativity'. As well as our visit to Halesowen Town Hall. We enjoyed experiencing a live show; 'There's a Monster in My Show.' We joined in dancing and singing and had a really good time.

We look forward to more exciting activities and learning opportunities in 2024. Until then we wish you all a very happy Christmas and healthy New Year!



Owl Class

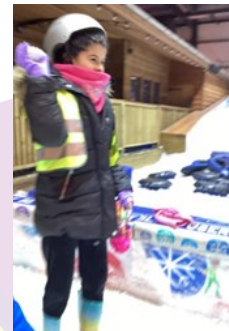

Through our topic 'Changes over Time', we have learnt about and explored seasonal changes, weather types, climates, continents and also some key historical figures such as Christopher Columbus and Captain Cook. We have read and explored various stories and texts together that link to our themes. Some of these have included, Elmer's Weather, Don't Hog the Hedge, Skip through the Seasons, Abracadabra it's Spring, One Snowy Night, Squirrel's busy Year and The Snowman. Through our English sessions, we have completed many activities that have supported and developed our language and communication skills. We have worked on our writing, spelling, and fine motor skills and have completed daily phonics sessions to support and develop our reading skills. In Maths, we have worked on our number and place value skills and have explored shape, size, capacity, mass, position and direction, pattern, time, money and symmetry. We have also completed focused learning tasks to develop our using and applying skills to promote our life long skills.

In Science, we again explored seasonal changes and the weather. We have also covered learning linked to light and dark, temperature, colour and plants. We have worked scientifically through experimenting and investigating themes and objects.

In PE, we have enjoyed developing our throwing and catching skills and have learnt and developed skills linked to Cricket from working with a cricket coach.

Learning through our topic has involved us in creating pieces of artwork, exploring and using technology and outdoor exploration linked to the weather and seasons. We had a fantastic time at the SnowDome to finish our topic work!



Frog Class

Frog class have had a fantastic first term. The children have enjoyed our topic 'Changes over Time'; they have been learning and exploring seasonal changes, weather types, climates, continents and also some key historical figures such as Christopher Columbus and Captain James Cook.

We have been reading and exploring various stories and texts together that link to our topic. Some of these included, Skip through the seasons, Elmer's weather, One year with Kipper, Don't Hog the Hedge, Abracadabra, It's Spring, And then comes Summer and One Snowy Night.

Throughout our Literacy lessons we have developed our skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening through a variety of activities linked to our topic. We have had daily phonics sessions and this has enabled the children to further develop in their reading and writing.

Our work in Maths, has continued to be based around the areas of number and place value, shape, space and measure. The using and applying of our maths skills linked to all of our work and learning opportunities and enabled us to promote our life long skills linked to maths.

In Science, we have learnt about temperature, weather and light and dark. We have also discovered what plants need in order to grow.

Our activities and learning throughout our topic have involved creating pieces of artwork and exploring technology. In art this term, the children explored seasonal colours and have had opportunities to mix colours and observe the changes.

In PE this term, we have developed our throwing and catching skills. We have also worked with a coach to learn and develop skills linked with the sport of Cricket.

The children have shown great enthusiasm and curiosity during the topic. We have enjoyed two fantastic trips to the SnowDome and The Sycamore Adventure playground. We are sure that this was a memorable experience for all.

Our topic for this half term has been 'It's good to be me'. We have been working hard but also having lots of fun. We have learnt about 5 senses, the names of our parts and different celebrations festivals such as Diwali, St Andrews Day and Black History.

We have read and explored various stories that link to our themes. Our favourites were 'Brown bear, brown bear, what can you see? And Polar bear, polar bear, what can you see?'. They loved looking at the different animals in the story. We have completed many activities linked to the stories to develop their language and communication skills. Through our writing session we have been working on writing our names and letter formation. We have completed daily phonics session to support and develop our reading skills.

We have completed lots of science activities, finding out about light and dark, listening and identifying different sounds and making quiet and loud noises. We have explored the 5 senses and have identified our head, shoulders, knees and toes.

Part of our topic this term in PE we have worked on climbing and travelling in different ways such as crawling, jumping and rolling.

One of our favourite activities this half term has been our trip to soft play. We got to have lots of fun crawling, going down the slide and watching materials move in the air.

We hope Bee Class and their families have a wonderful Christmas break and look forward to welcoming everyone back in 2024!



Ladybird class

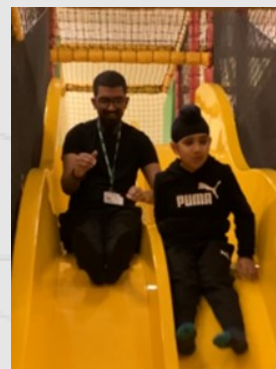

This term we have had a super time working on our topic, Good To Be Me. We have learned about our features, made self-portraits and enjoyed exploring our senses. In Science we have explored the names of different body parts; and as part of our RE work we have looked at different festivals celebrated by us and our friends.

During our English lessons we have worked hard to practise writing our names and are continuing to develop our pencil control, mark-making and letter formation skills. We have explored lots of lovely stories linked to our topic this term, such as Funny Bones, The Little Red Hen, Brown Bear Brown Bear What Do You See, Polar Bear Polar Bear What Do You Hear and Dear Santa.

In Maths we have engaged with numbers practically, through play and song. We have also worked on developing our counting skills and explored ordering numbers, as well as taking part in learning based on addition, subtraction and sharing. During our shape, space and measure work we have matched and sorted 2D shapes, role played with money and explored sequencing time. We have also taken part in learning based on time and measuring length, capacity and mass. In Science this term we have worked on labelling body parts, exploring our senses, light and dark and electricity.

During our PE lessons this term we have focused on developing our gross motor skills by climbing on and through apparatus, we have also enjoyed travelling in different ways across pieces of PE equipment. Ladybirds had lots of fun during our trip to the soft play room at Crystal Leisure Centre; we applied our physical skills brilliantly!



Woodpecker Class

Our topic this half term has been 'Good to be Me'. The children have explored a range of books within our English sessions. A particular favourite was 'Pete the Cat's Lunch'. The children handled different foods to communicate which they liked and disliked. They also made their own sandwiches. Within Phonics, the children have learnt some level 2 sounds. They have handled objects that contain the phoneme sound as well as trying hard to make marks to represent the grapheme. During maths, we have developed our number recognition and counting skills. Within our topic sessions, the children have learnt about places that are familiar to them. They have enjoyed travelling on the minibus to look at our local area whilst visiting Sycamore Adventure. The children have thoroughly enjoyed our music sessions. Using a range of instruments, they have performed in front of their peers. They have also loved listening to Christmas songs and practicing for our Christmas play.

Lunchtime Clubs

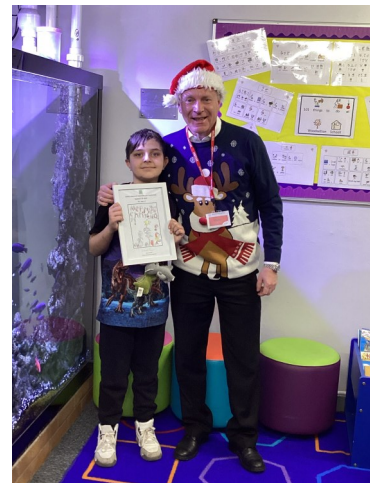
