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<b>Music Development Plan</b>	
<b>1 – Overall objective</b>	<p>At Woodsetton School, music education is an integral component of our curriculum, delivered through a structured programme. Each week, pupils receive dedicated music lessons, designed to engage and nurture their musical abilities. Our flexible scheme empowers non-specialist teachers to deliver music education to our pupils, ensuring that every child, irrespective of their learning difficulties, can participate and progress in their musical journey. The scheme includes over 60 creative songs and pieces spread across 24 units over a two-year cycle. The units offer a rich collection of age-appropriate material that resonates with and supports our pupils.</p> <p>The music tracks have been meticulously engineered to create an immersive learning environment where pupils feel as though there is a vocalist present in the classroom. This design allows them to hear and feel the beat while playing. The song lyrics used are crafted to be easily articulated and memorable, providing a foundation for a variety of musical activities. Our partnership with Dudley Performing Arts enhances this curriculum, bringing additional expertise and resources to our music programme.</p>

<p><b>3- Co-Curricular Music</b></p>	<p>Beyond the curriculum, Woodsetton School offers numerous opportunities for pupils to engage in music outside of regular lesson time. We conduct weekly singing assemblies and an afternoon singing choir lunchtime club. These sessions provide pupils with a platform to express themselves musically and develop their talents in a supportive and enthusiastic environment. Additionally, our pupils have the chance to share their musical skills with the wider community through events held at least twice a year.</p> <p>Our gifted and talented pupils have the opportunity to access acoustic guitar lessons once a week. To support their musical development, the school and Dudley Performing Arts provides guitars for these pupils to borrow and take home for practise. This initiative ensures that all pupils, regardless of their personal circumstances, have the resources they need to enhance their skills and pursue their passion for music. By offering these lessons and lending instruments, we aim to nurture their talents and provide them with the tools to succeed in their musical journey.</p>
<p><b>4 – Classroom instrumental teaching</b></p>	<p>Within lesson time, pupils have the chance to learn to sing or play an instrument using our 24 clear, progressive unit plans over a two-year curriculum cycle. The units are accompanied by over 60 original and distinctive tracks. These units are crafted to be pupil-centred and differentiated by outcome, catering to age-appropriate music that spans a diverse range of styles, including Waltz, Garage, Jazz, and March. The songs and pieces, featuring catchy melodies and instrumental sections, are designed to engage pupils actively and support them in their musical journey. Each key in the songs is chosen to support staff in singing comfortably, ensuring that the music sounds authentic and engaging in the classroom. The school’s partnership with Dudley Performing Arts significantly enhances our music provision, providing pupils with access to additional resources and expertise. <p><b>5 – Outside of Classroom instrumental teaching</b></p>	<p>Private music tuition is also available outside of school hours through our collaboration with Dudley Performing Arts. This arrangement allows pupils seeking individualised instruction to benefit from specialised teaching. Looking forward, we are exploring opportunities to organise trips that would allow pupils to attend live concerts and other musical events. These experiences are crucial in exposing pupils to a variety of musical genres and professional performances, broadening their understanding and appreciation of music.</p>
<p><b>7 – Transition work with local secondary schools</b></p>	<p>We are committed to supporting the transition from Year 6 to Year 7 by maintaining strong communication with local secondary schools to ensure continuity in musical engagement. Our partnerships will help pupils carry their passion for music forward, reinforcing the skills and knowledge they have gained.</p>
<p><b>8 – Summary Action Plan</b></p>	<p>Looking to the future, Woodsetton School has ambitious plans to further enrich our music education programme. We aim to develop one-to-one tuition opportunities to provide personalised instruction that caters to individual pupil needs and aspirations. Additionally, we plan to establish a school band, offering pupil more avenues to showcase their talents and collaborate with peers.</p> <p>We also envision regular school performances where classes present their musical achievements at least once a term.</p>
